## ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL POLICY

## Rationale:

 Well-coordinated procedures for students arriving for school, and for the dismissal of students from school improves student safety, enhances learning time, and improves communication between all parties.

## **Implementation:**

- Yard duty teachers are on duty each morning from 8:30 am.
- At the beginning of the school day, at 8.55am, when music is played for 1 minute and students and staff enter the classroom and set themselves up for a successful learning day.
- The start of school is 9.00am, when a bell is rung.
- All children are expected to arrive at school each morning between 8:30am and 8.55am.
- Children <u>are not</u> to arrive at school before 8.30am, unless there is a prior arrangement due to special circumstances between the school and the parents.
- Students arriving at school before 8.30am, by arrangement, must sit in the foyer until the yard duty teacher is on duty for supervision in the playground.
- Any child who arrives after 9:00am must report to the office before going to their classroom.
- The Business Manager will provide a Late Pass, and the child will attend class as normal.
- Late arrivals are to be recorded in the attendance roll by the Business Manager and marked as Late.
- Children are to arrive at line promptly when the music is playing and the bell rings.
- Teachers are also expected to be at line promptly when the bell rings.
- A bell will sound at 3:20pm each day, when all students will be dismissed
- Town and Country bus travellers are to present themselves to the bus duty teacher promptly after dismissal.
- No child is to be dismissed early from school without written permission from a parent, carer or principal. Parents/carers of children who are to be dismissed early are to complete and sign the Early Dismissal Form before picking up their child/children. No child will be dismissed without an adult to sign this form.
- It is not permissible for anyone else to collect a child from the school without prior approval of a parent, carer, or principal.
- Yard duty teachers will be on duty from 3:20pm to 3:30pm daily.
- Children are required to leave the school grounds as soon as possible after dismissal unless they are engaged in an after-school activity. Any child who is still waiting for a parent at the conclusion of the teachers' yard duty (3.30pm) is to be escorted to the office and wait until the parent arrives.
- The yard duty teacher will provide the name to the principal, who will record the incident, and may choose to contact the parents.
